

GREGORY A. HIRSCHAUER

Greg Hirschauer is a former college, professional and current amateur men's soccer player. Greg has played for the University of Dayton Soccer Club, was in the U.S. Marine Corps National Soccer pool, played/trained with the Dayton Dynamo (NPSL) and Cincinnati Cheetahs (USISL) and is currently a top Region II men's goalkeeper for FC Kolping. FC Kolping Men's Soccer has been Ohio South and Region II champions several times in recent years. Consequently, Greg is able to bring a player AND Trainer/Coach's perspective to the game of soccer.



Greg is currently the Boys Varsity Coach at Cincinnati Country Day High School (18th year/173-107-32 record), and has been a High School Soccer Coach for 24 years, including years as an Assistant Coach at Cincinnati Country Day and Turpin High School, where he was a member of the staff when Turpin was Ohio State Champion and Ohio Runner-up (1985). Greg has been Ohio Boys High School Coach of the Year (2000) and a 5-time SW Ohio Coach of the Year (1996, 1997, 1999, 2000, 2003).

Greg has been coaching youth soccer and club soccer for 20 years. As a Goalkeeper Trainer he has trained more than 3500 goalkeepers, both at the local and regional levels. Greg has trained thousands of field players as well, and has had more than 300 former players/trainers who have gone on to play college soccer. Of his former players, 7 have achieved All-American status, 41 have been All-Regional Players and 76 have been All-State.

Greg has coached in 9 Ohio South State Cup Finals, winning 7 State Cups. His teams have been to the Region II Semi-Finals 6 times and the Regional II Finals 4 times. In 2001 his Kolping Ben-Gals U-17 Team won the Regional Championship and finished as National Runners-up. In 2003 his Kolping Ben-Gals U-19 Team won the Regional Championship and finished as National Finalists. Greg's licenses include NSCAA National Diploma, NSCAA National Youth Diploma and NSCAA Advanced Goalkeeper Diploma.

Outside of soccer, Greg is an attorney specializing in tax and financial services. Greg is also a volunteer attorney for the Volunteer Lawyers Project.

Greg received his Bachelor's Degree from the University of Dayton, where he was named to "Who's Who in American Universities," and received his Juris Doctorate from the University of Cincinnati Law School. He served in the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve (1984-1990) and was given an honorable discharge. Greg is currently involved with Big Brothers/Big Sisters. Greg lives in the New Richmond area.
